About SMA: Spinal muscular atrophy is a genetic motor neuron disease caused by the progressive degeneration of nerve cells in the spinal cord and brainstem. SMA rapidly destroys a child's muscle control and strength, leading to the progressive inability to walk, stand, sit up, eat, and ultimately, breathe. Over 50 percent of patients with SMA die before the age of two. There are three types of childhood SMA. Type I is the most severe and most children afflicted with this form of the disease do not reach their first birthday.
